



Nueces County Juvenile Probation Department Visitation Rules

1. All visitors must abide by the rules and policies of the Detention Center and Juvenile Supervision Officers. Failure to comply will result in loss of visitation privileges.
2. To maximize security of residents, staff and visitors, any person entering the Detention Center is subject to frisk search or scanned with a metal detector.
3. Personal belongings are not allowed in the Detention Center. Please lock your purse, backpacks, bags, etc. securely in your vehicle.
4. Disorderly behavior will result in termination of the visit and the police department being contacted.
5. Individuals suspected of being intoxicated and/or under the influence of drugs will not be allowed to visit.
6. Any attempt by a visitor to bring contraband into the Detention Center results in the loss of visitation privileges and/or criminal charges filed. Contraband includes but is not limited to food, candy, cigarettes, vapes, drugs, weapons, cell phones, etc., or any item **NOT** authorized by the Department.
7. No eating, drinking, or smoking is allowed during visits. Do not bring treats, snacks, grooming items, books, letters, toys, or any other contraband into the Detention Center.
8. **Only Parents or Legal Guardians who have been CLEARED by the Probation Officer can visit a resident. Only ONE parent/legal guardian will be allowed to visit at a time. Each visitor must have a valid form of ID.**
9. Nueces County resident visits are limited to 30 minutes. Out-of-County resident visits are limited to 1 hour. Visits may be cut short if circumstances arise. In situations including two or more residents (brothers or sisters) the 30 minutes can be used for one visit with both residents together and/or divided into 15 minutes each.
10. No juvenile may have more than one visiting period per day.

12. Special visits must be requested and approved through the juvenile's probation officer. Restrictions do apply.
13. No child under the age of 17 should be left unattended in the lobby.
14. If you are experiencing any symptoms of the common cold, Flu, or COVID-19, please stay home.
15. All the above is subject to change without notice.

- No shorts, skirts, short (mini) dresses, or sleeves shirts.
- No spandex pants, spandex shorts, or other form-fitting clothes.
- No low cut or backless shirts.
- No transparent clothing.
- No inappropriate gestures, memes, profanity, nudity, or drugs allowed on clothing.
- No hats, caps, bandanas, or beanies.
- No sunglasses.
- No hand-carried items.
